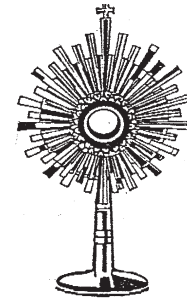

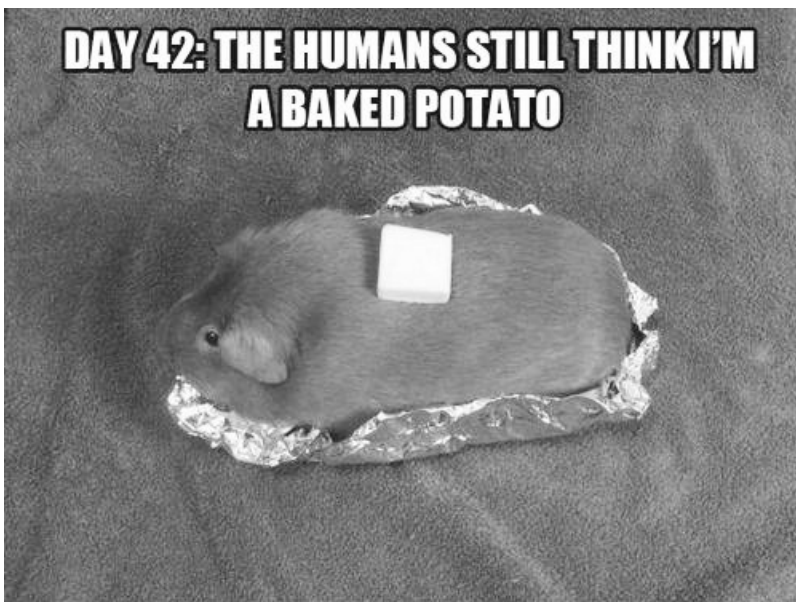

## SERMON FOR NINETEENTH SUNDAY

Jesus sure does talk about bread a lot. There's a good reason for that. Unless you were the very rich who ate meat, most people of his day ate bread to live. Bread was so important in the life of God's people that it took on a spiritual meaning. Bread symbolized God providing for His people. We see Elijah running away from Jezebel who wanted to kill him like she did all the other prophets. Elijah ran for his life into the desert. He sat down under a tree, exhausted and dejected, He asked God to take his life, then he fell asleep. But God provided for him a "hearth cake," which is like a super bread filled with eggs, lots of butter and sugar. I think today we would call that a pan cake. With this food that God provided Elijah had the strength to escape to the mountain where Moses received the Ten Commandments.

Jesus today is pleading with the people to believe God has provided for them a new "super bread" not of eggs, butter and sugar but a "living" bread that if you eat this bread it will give you life forever. This bread is living because it contains the complete "glorified" Body of Jesus who lives in Heaven. The "flesh" that Jesus wants you to eat is His glorified Body that can do anything. It can even exist in a small piece of Bread. God, the All Powerful Creator of Everything, who willed to lower Himself by taking on our flesh in Jesus is also willing to place the glorified flesh of His Son Jesus into a one inch round piece of bread worth about a nickel. Why does He do this? Because God wants complete union with you now and forever in Heaven. God's desire to want this and what He did by willing Jesus to die on the Cross to make this happen boggles my mind. We are not worthy of such a great gift. God doesn't care about that. He wants what He wants. Enjoy your journey to God.

As we journey to God, He provides what we need *now* to help us or help another on the journey home. Hours before writing this sermon, God provided a blessing that I can only call "Divine Providence." Our little radio station, WLRU, is a gift from God providing good Catholic teaching 15 hours a day. Jesus said, "They shall all be taught by God." WLRU furthers that mission. But a serious problem developed that could financially hurt the station.

The heart of any radio studio is the audio board. It controls all the sound going to the transmitter from the on air mic to the various networks coming down the line. Our current board was made in 1991. After 27 years, we can no longer get parts for it. The power supply is on its last leg. If that goes, we're off the air. A new board costs about ten thousand dollars. There's not enough bake sells to raise that type of money. God provided.

I received the regular email from the Catholic Radio Update sent out to all Catholic Radio Stations. As I scrolled down the page, I couldn't believe what I was seeing. A Catholic station in Omaha Nebraska, KVSS, is getting rid of a 2002 Audio Board, which was bought brand new and had only one owner.... who used it only for church. When I checked for the price, I read, "I'm not asking anything for these." It said "these" because they are giving two of these boards away for *free!* These two boards even used would go for fifteen thousand dollars! I called Larue for his advice if we should get these. He yelled back in the phone, "Pack 'em up. Pack 'em up." A commercial truck will be delivering them soon. God is good.
