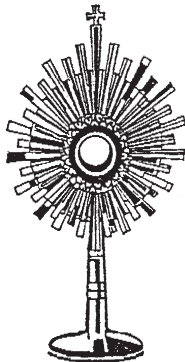

FR. MIKE'S SERMON FOR PENTECOST

When you are baptized, Jesus pours like a spring of water the power of the Holy Spirit into your soul to influence not only your life for the better, but also to be a positive influence on the lives of others. Here are the Twelve Fruits that show you are filled with the Holy Spirit: Love, generosity, joy, gentleness, peace, faithfulness, patience, modesty, kindness, self-control, goodness and chastity. I will briefly define and describe those using examples from children:



Love – Selfless giving. “Love is when grandpa sits on the floor to cut grand-ma’s toenails, even though it hurts his knees a lot.”

Generosity – Giving to make someone else happy, too. “One Halloween, my brother gave me half his candy when my paper bag broke and I lost all mine. He even gave me the Butterfingers!”

Joy – How we react to God’s Kindness. “Joy is when mom makes me chocolate chip cookies and it’s not even my birthday or Christmas.”

Gentleness – Refusing to be angry or mean. “I didn’t mean to break my sister’s favorite toy, but when she could have broken one of mine, she didn’t.

Peace – The feeling that comes from being right with God, others and yourself. “I feel peace at Christmas because we all stop fighting.”

Faithfulness – Consistent loyalty, no matter what the cost. “My friend got glasses for the first time and I told him he looked cool, though he really looked like a nerd. I made sure bullies didn’t pick on him.”
