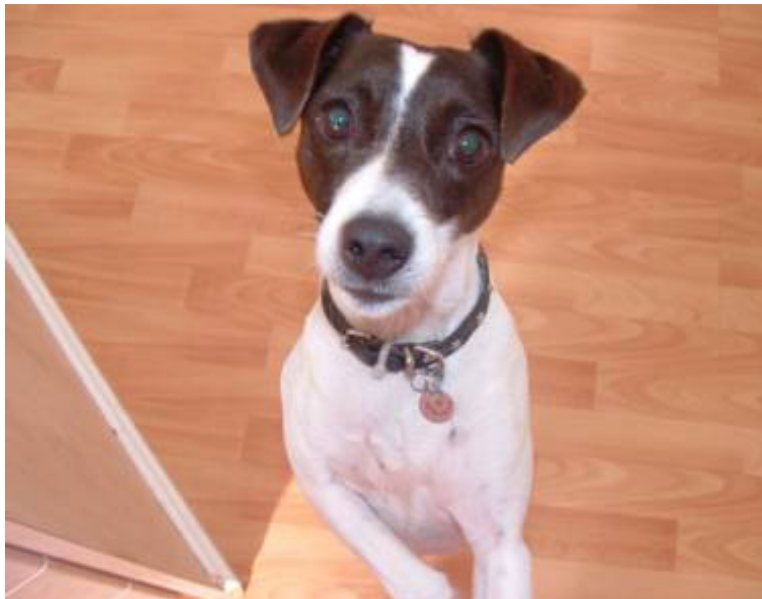
## NEWS AROUND THE PARISH
