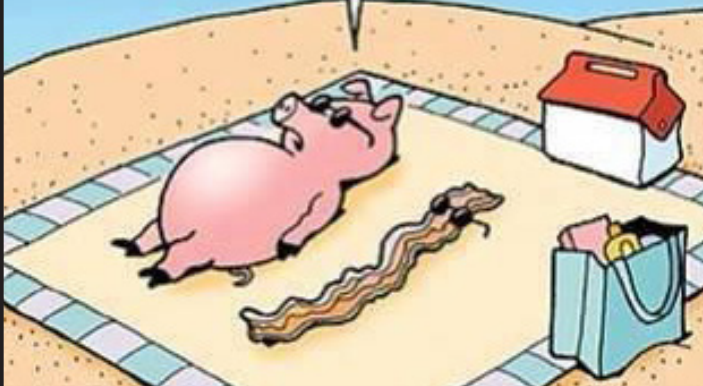

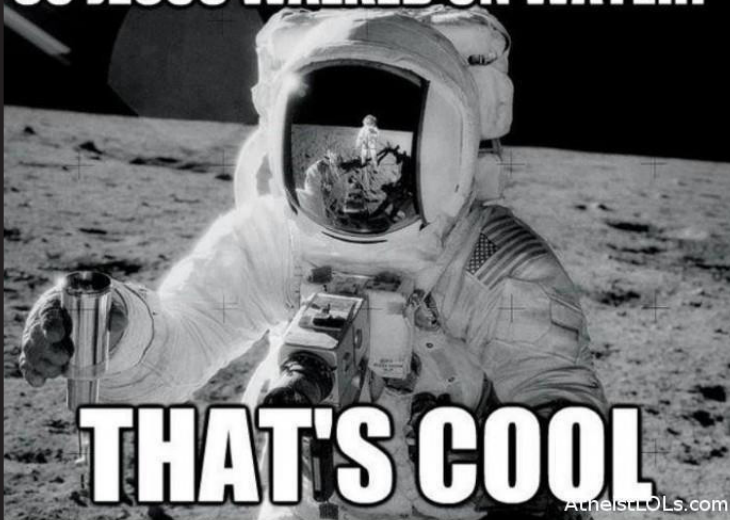

FR. MIKE'S SERMON FOR EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY

There is one thing God wants you to do that is more important than anything else you will ever do in your life, more important than finding the right spouse to marry, or having children, or becoming a priest, or getting promoted in your job. "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in the One He sent."

Believing in Jesus is the greatest accomplishment you can achieve because it gives meaning and purpose and joy to everything you do in this life, followed by eternal life after you draw your last breath. I share with you now the wisdom from our honorary parishioner who has resided for 30 years at the Hocking Prison in Nelsonville, Ohio. I preached about him before by referring to him as simply "J" to respect his privacy. He wants everyone to know his real name is James. I don't know what mistakes James made in life to get him there, but he is spending the rest of his life accomplishing the main work of God – believing in Jesus. Because of this belief he is able to write to me a letter with these uplifting words even while imprisoned. Here are a few excerpts: "I am doing just fine. When you are right with God, everything is just fine....I am truly overwhelmed with the Holy Spirit's joy...Wow is all I could think and say to the amount of joy the Holy Spirit has filled my heart with...I am so Blessed...I am living a Blessed life and I live every day trying to deserve it."

To find "joy" and "feel blessed" even while in prison shows how believing in Jesus has the power to lift you up over anything in life that tries to bring you down. The biggest blessing I receive when I believe in Jesus is that I don't have to be afraid of the unknown. Have you ever had the experience of something bad happening to you, leaving you wondering, "What's next?" On January 21, 1974, my whole world came crashing down when the Superior of the Franciscan Order, Fr. Vincent, told me, "You have no call to priesthood. Go home and get married." Was everything I worked for over nine years a mistake? What do I do with my life now? I was so depressed, anxious and afraid. But Jesus came to my rescue in the valley of darkness. My belief in Jesus was not a mistake. Jesus put my shattered heart back together by bringing to me so many people who loved me. I was so afraid that I was a failure. Their love and acceptance made me feel "OK" again. Then Jesus offered me hope by opening doors that led me right back to priesthood. My faith in Him guided me to where Jesus wanted me to be. My belief in Jesus taught me this most important lesson about what He will always do for me and you. I can show it to you in a sign I found lying on the floor at the Withamsville Good Will Store, "Don't Let Anyone Dull Your Sparkle." My belief in Jesus made me shine again!

James is so correct. I want to live every day, every moment of my earthly life trying to deserve the blessings that have poured upon me because I believe in Jesus. The best way to deserve it is by getting others to believe in Jesus so He can make them sparkle, too.
