

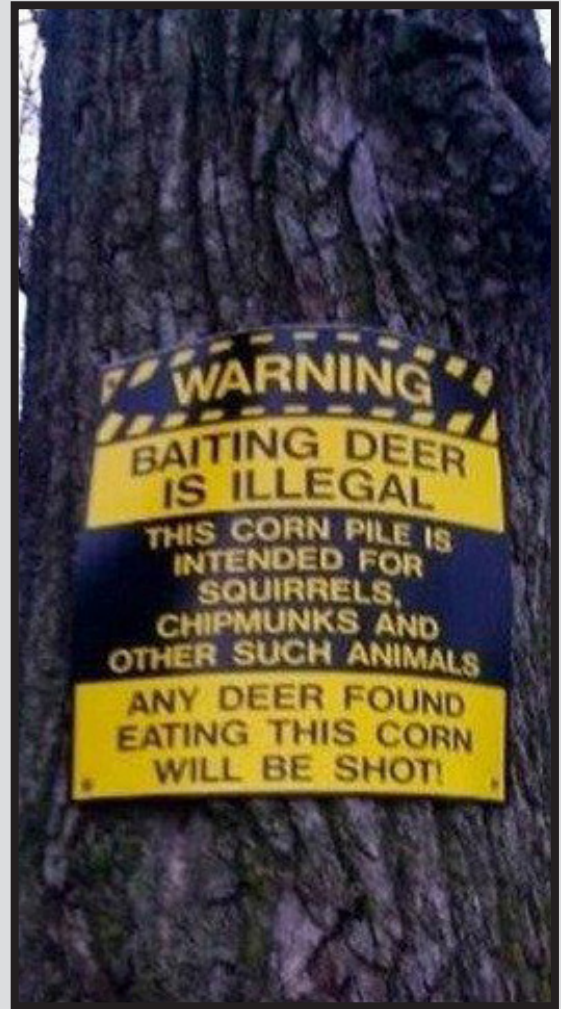
NEWS AROUND THE PARISH
