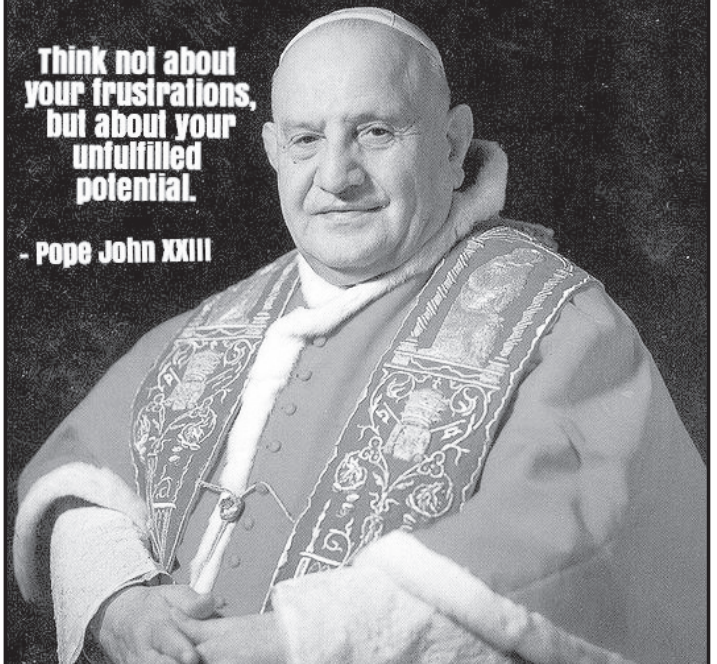


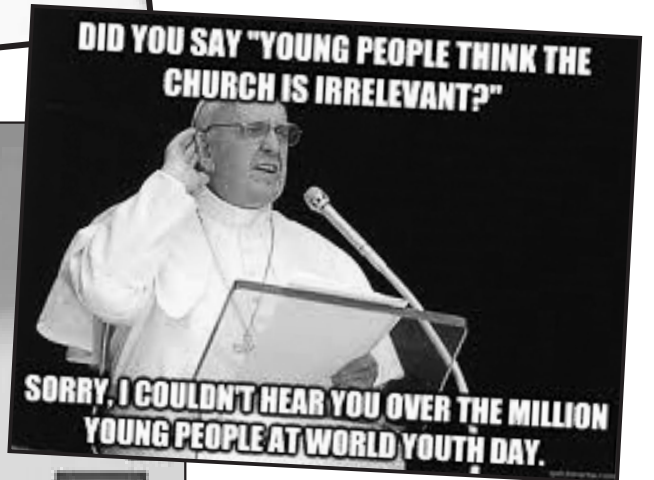
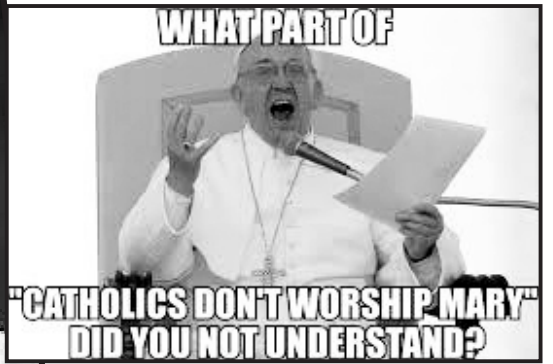

SERMON FOR THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY

Old Dr. Geezer became very bored in retirement and decided to open a clinic. He put a sign up outside that said: “Dr. Geezer’s clinic. Specialist treatment for \$500. If not cured, you get back \$1,000.”

Doctor Young, who was positive that this old Dr. Geezer didn’t know anything about modern medicine, thought this would be a great opportunity to make a quick \$1,000. So he went to Dr. Geezer’s clinic.

Dr. Young: “Dr. Geezer, I have lost all taste in my mouth. Can you please help me?”

Dr. Geezer: “Nurse, please bring medicine from box 22 and put 3 drops in Dr. Young’s mouth.”

Dr. Young: “Aaagh!! -- That’s Motor Oil!”

Dr. Geezer: “Congratulations! You’ve got your taste back. That will be \$500.”

Dr. Young is annoyed and returns after a couple of days figuring to recover his money.

Dr. Young: “I have lost my memory, I cannot remember anything.”

Dr. Geezer: “Nurse, please bring medicine once again from box 22 and put 3 drops in the patient’s mouth.”

Dr. Young: “Oh, no you don’t. That’s Motor Oil!”

Dr. Geezer: “Congratulations! You’ve got your memory back. That will be \$500.”

Dr. Young leaves angrily. He just lost \$1,000 dollars. He comes back after several days to win his money back.

Dr. Young: “My eyesight has become weak. I can hardly see anything.”

Dr. Geezer: “Well, I don’t have any medicine for that so, here’s your \$1,000 back.” Dr. Geezer gives him a \$10.00 bill instead.

Dr. Young: “This isn’t \$1,000 bucks. It’s only ten dollars!”

Dr. Geezer: “Congratulations! You got your vision back! That will be \$500.”

Moral of the story—Just because you’re “Young” doesn’t mean that you can outsmart an “old Geezer”!

In the Gospel today all those rich people were dumping in gold coins to the temple treasury. They would pour from a huge bag small coins of a lesser amount into something that looked like a golden tuba. Everyone would hear the sound of the coins clanking against the metal horn. The pouring would last a long time because there were so many little coins. They tried to outsmart everyone by giving the impression they were offering so much money to the treasury, but the value of the coins was small. In this way they would look good and win the praise of the onlookers. They made no sacrifice at all because these seemingly large amounts were extra cash they didn’t need.

Then there’s the poor woman who gave only two coins – clink...clink. No applause for her. No special recognition nor praise. But Jesus saw the true value of her offering. She gave all she had.

In your judgment before God, He will measure the value of all the good things you do by the sacrifice you make to do them. The greater the sacrifice, the greater the love. The greater the love, the greater glory you give to God. You may have various reasons for doing something good. It makes you feel good. It makes the other feel good. It may even help you score points with another. But the purest motivation for doing good should be for the love of Jesus who gave up everything to do good for you. In the Bible Jesus promises to repay you a hundredfold for all the sacrifices you make for Him. Dr. Geezer would say, “Congratulations.” Jesus would say, “Well done, good and faithful servant!” Now go make Jesus happy.
