He looked at me and said, “Then why on earth do you want to live to be 100?”



SERMON FOR CHRIST THE KING

It is easy to misunderstand this Gospel. Is Jesus saying all you have to do to get to Heaven is just do good deeds? What about faith in Jesus? Jesus doesn't say a thing about saving you. Is doing good works more important than His death on the cross? The answer can be found in 8 words from verse 34: "Come, you who are blessed by my Father." The "Blessed" are those who already see their own sinfulness and turn to Jesus for mercy. They already have faith in Jesus who saved them by dying on the cross. The blessed have already experienced Jesus in a personal way. They then show their love for Jesus by showing that love for others. The "blessed of my Father" are those whose lives have already been changed by accepting Jesus as their savior. Their love for Jesus compels them to share blessings with others in need. True faith always leads to service. Those who went to hell showed they had no love for the needy because they had no love for the God who created them.

Remember in Star Wars when Darth Vader blew up this planet and Obi Wan Kenobi says, "I felt a great disturbance in the Force, as if millions of voices suddenly cried out in terror and were suddenly silenced. I fear something terrible has happened." I have always believed this "Force" was based upon the Catholic belief in the "Mystical Body of Christ." All of us are united in a spiritual union with each other and with God. Jesus declares that what you did or didn't do for His "brothers" was like if you did or didn't do it for Jesus Himself.

This is the basis for the very First Rule of St. Benedict – Hospitality. St. Benedict said that to welcome a stranger with kindness is the same as welcoming Jesus. There is the story of a Benedictine Monk who worked all weekend welcoming pilgrims to the Monastery. He was so tired. He just wanted to lock the door and go to bed, happy they all left. As he was shuffling his tired feet to his room, he hears a knock at the door. There stood another large group of pilgrims seeking lodging at the monastery. The monk muttered, "Jesus, is it you again?"

In your judgment you probably won't remember all the good or bad things you did throughout your life. But you will remember how someone else made you feel. I was walking up my kitchen steps last week, feeling a little sad over all the sick people I see during the holidays. I was intercepted by Miles Fouch who climbed the steps to hand me two sticks he picked up from the playground. He put them in the form of a cross and gave me a big hug. It's like Jesus was saying, "I hug those who suffer." He gave me the two sticks. Then other kids started to climb the steps with a stick in their hand for me. One kid said, "I love you. Here's a stick." Those kids made my day. They lifted my spirits. They won't remember the kind thing they did for me. But I will... and so will God. I never knew a small stick given with love can become such a force for good.
